Collection & Drop off Times

Could we please ask that parents be mindful of the times they are booked to drop off and collect their children. While it may seem like just 10 or 15 minutes it may result in members of our team having to stay late at the end of their day or that we are no longer compliant regarding our staff to child ratio. Repeated failure to collect one's child on time may also result in a £30 charge for the first 30min and an additional £30 for every 30min thereafter. We do understand that things can happen and that parents will at times be held up. However in these instances we would ask that you call us to let us know you are running late and when you estimate your arrival. Similarly if you need to drop your child off early we would ask that you call ahead to check with the staff that they can accommodate this or if it is in advance send an email to parents@radnorparkkindergarten.com so we can book the early drop off in.

TAX Free Childcare

You can get up to £500 every 3 months (£2,000 a year) for each of your children to help with the costs of childcare.

If you get Tax-Free Childcare, the government will pay £2 for every £8 you pay your childcare provider. This is paid via an online childcare account that you set up for your child.

You can get Tax-Free Childcare at the same time as 30 hours free childcare if you're eligible for both.
